



# Phenylglycine & Phenylalanine Analyzed with HPLC - AppNote

## Analysis using a Simple Mobile Phase.

In this Method two important amino acids: L-(+)-alpha-phenylglycine and L-phenylalanine, were Separated.

C18 Columns used today which may be present in every Analytical Laboratory may not be able to Retain underivatized Amino Acids. They usually elute at or near the "void volume" with other polar compounds.





#### **Peaks:**

1. L-(+)-Alpha-Phenylglycine

2. L-Phenylalanine

### **Method Conditions**

Column: Cogent Silica-C™, 4μm, 100Å

**Catalog No.:** 40000-75P **Dimensions:** 4.6 x 75mm

**Mobile Phase:** 

A: DI Water / 0.1% Formic Acid B: Acetonitrile / 0.1% Formic Acid

**Flow rate:** 1.0mL / minute **Detection:** UV @ 254nm

Injection vol.: 2µL

Sample Preparation: 0.3mg / mL of each sample dissolved in 50:50 Acetonitrile / DI Water / 0.5% Formic Acid.

**to:** 0.85 minutes

Notes: Alpha - amino acids are precursors for many important chemical entities (for example isoindolines), which



are essential to the discovery of new drugs.
